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
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


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
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
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
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





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








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
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#### BALLET SPARTANBURG 2023-2024 COMPANY DANCERS

Mr. Fernandaz was awarded a gold medal in the Cuban Ballet Contest (Pas de Deux category), a gold medal in Calabria (Italy), a gold medal in the South Africa International Contest, and a silver medal in the Dominican Republic. Jonhal was the Artistic Director of US International Ballet prior to joining Ballet Spartanburg.
